## TRAVEL INFORMATION

There are daily direct flights to Ottawa from New York and Baltimore. From other US points of departure you will have to fly to Montreal or Toronto and then on to Ottawa via a connecting flight.

Because of deregulation travel arrangements can best be made locally. Note, however, that there is usually a considerable advantage if you schedule your return flight for Sunday, with savings ranging up to 50 per cent of normal fare. Be sure to ask your travel agent about this.

Ottawa International Airport is about a ten-to fifteen minute taxi ride from downtown Ottawa. The cost is in the neighbourhood of \$13.00. There is a special airport bus (white and blue) which services major hotels: the cost is \$4.50 per trip. You will find taxis and the bus at the airport exit, just beyond the baggage area and the car rental counters.

There are daily Amtrak trains running to Montreal from the principal cities on the eastern seaboard. From Montreal there are six connecting trains running to Ottawa daily. From Ottawa Station you can take either a taxi (about \$11.00) or a municipal bus (red and white, no. 95) to the city centre (eighty-five cents in change).

If you take a taxi from the airport or the station, tell the driver to take you directly to Stanton Hall in the University of Ottawa. If you take the bus, get off at the Château Laurier, the most centrally located downtown hotel. The University of Ottawa is about a ten-minute walk or a quite short taxi ride from there.

Ottawa is also within a comfortable day's driving distance from New York, Boston or Philadelphia. Parking facilities will be available at the University of Ottawa and at Carleton University.

## ACCOMMODATION

Double and single rooms have been reserved at Stanton Hall, a student residence at the University of Ottawa. It is located close to the city centre and is quite inexpensive — about a third of the cost of downtown hotels. The rates are \$20.00 per day for single occupancy, \$14.00 per day for double occupancy. Please return the enclosed registration card.

If you would prefer to sample Ottawa's two classic

hotels, you can make reservations directly with either *Le Château Laurier* (613-232-6411; about \$85.00 per day) or the *Lord Elgin* (613-235-3333; \$43-\$48.00 per day).

## REGISTRATION

## FOREIGN EXCHANGE

All prices above are in Canadian dollars, which are currently worth about eighty US cents: i.e. one US dollar buys about Cdn \$1.20-\$1.25. Shops and restaurants in Ottawa will accept payment in US currency, but you cannot always be sure that you will receive full exchange premium. It is better to exchange US funds for Canadian dollars at any chartered bank downtown or those located on the campuses of Carleton University and the University of Ottawa.
